KLARA KRKOSKA 1929 - 2013

In contrast, we note sadly the passing of Klara Krkoska on 23rd. December 2013. Just two weeks earlier Klara had enjoyed Christmas dinner with her Association friends The fact that such a large number of those friends attended Klara's funeral shows how devoted she was to Twinning. This is hardly surprising, seeing she was a truly international person and very much shaped by the difficult times through which she lived. Klara was born in the German speaking part of Czechoslovakia where German was her first language. Klara's father worked away from home and when her mother died when she was 10, she had to work on the family farm. At the end of the war Klara was forced to work on the land in Germany. The British Red Cross helped put her in touch with her sister and arranged for her to come to England, where she began a new life. She met her husband, Alex and they worked hard and thrived in

their adopted country. In later life, Klara became involved in BMCTA; visited Tulle and Schorndorf many times and was a welcoming host to visitors. She will be remembered for her outgoing personality, her generosity and that certain sparkle in her eyes evinced a warm sense of humour. Klara will be greatly missed.

VISIT TO SCHORNDORF

We have booked a coach to take us to Schorndorf in March. It will leave Market Street, Bury early on Thursday 27. March, will cross the channel by tunnel and arrive the



same evening at Saint Quentin where rooms are being booked at the Hotel Ibis Basilique for our overnight stay. We will leave the hotel after breakfast the next morning and expect to arrive in Schorndorf at about 5pm. that evening.

During our visit it is likely that we

will travel to the picturesque and



ancient town of Rothenburg, made famous over the years in many films from Pinocchio (Walt Disney, surprisingly perhaps in 1940), to more recently Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows.

Stuttgart will also be on the itinerary We will begin our journey home on Tuesday 1st April and again we will rest overnight in Saint Quentin and arrive back in Bury during the afternoon of Wednesday 2nd. April. The cost of the visit will depend whether people have a single or double room during the overnight stays. Members requiring a single room will pay £318 per person. A double room will cost £270 per person.
